s performance in my class has been characterized by his consistent and exemplary achievement, combined a genuine determination to excel. Highly self-motivated, he has dedicated himself to academic excellence throughout our time together and is a role model among a highly competitive and talented senior class.

During his junior year with me, consistently earned grades in the mid-nineties. Last year was not an easy one. Due to the pandemic, Malden Catholic adopted a hybrid model which combined days of in person learning with remote instruction. Despite the challenges of this system, the students in this honors class rose to the occasion. The emphasis of the course is the acquisition of vocabulary and the use of grammatical accuracy through guided practice. The four skills of language learning; speaking, reading, writing, and listening comprehension, are practiced daily, and assessed frequently. Throughout his junior year and now, as a senior, impresses me with his consistency and overall excellence. A strong and gifted writer, his work demonstrates excellent grammatical accuracy, ease of expression and organization. All his work, be it daily homework, tests, or a response to formal and informal writing prompts show evidence of comprehension. Thoughtful and prepared, he commits himself to doing his best daily. I have witnessed great growth in his oral proficiency and his listening comprehension during our time together. He has become much more comfortable and confident in his ability to express himself with fluency and to decipher complex, native Spanish in written and spoken form. As evidence of his achievement and proficiency in the language, earned a "medalla de plata", a silver medal, for his excellent grade of 85 in the spring of his junior year on the National Spanish examination, a rigorous on-line test administered throughout the country to over one hundred and forty thousand native and non-native Spanish speakers. I was very proud of this noteworthy achievement.

This year has chosen to take AP Spanish Language and Culture with me. Our class is comprised of only eleven native and non-native high achieving young men. Each are expected to contribute fully every day. It is a fast paced, intensive course which meets daily and is equivalent to a fifth semester college course. Authentic materials are read, discussed, and analyzed and the target language is used exclusively. The students in my AP classes are motivated to perform well on the exam. Historically ninety- eight percent of my students have passed the AP exam. Approximately ninety-five percent

receive scores of a four or five out of a possible five on the test. Because he has done such marvelous work thus far, with a current grade of 94, I fully expect to achieve similar success on the exam in May.

A transfer student who came to us in the fall of his sophomore year quickly adapted to the academic rigors of Malden Catholic and he has proven the depth of his intellect and has also demonstrated his great appetite for intellectual challenge from his first day here. This year, is currently taking two Advanced Placement courses and is maintaining high grades in both. In total, has taken five advanced placement courses. He has surely prepared himself for the rigors of a demanding college program.

Beyond our classroom acquaintance, I know that is deeply involved in the extracurricular life of Malden Catholic High School. A member of the National Honor Society, he has earned consistently high grades throughout his time here. will soon be inducted into the Spanish National Honor Society, la Sociedad Honoraria Hispánica, for his four-year average of ninety or above and his sustained excellence and interest in the Spanish language and culture. He was also selected as a member of our Saint Francis Xavier program, a group of our finest students who experience a variety of college preparedness opportunities. In addition to his academic achievements, also contributes significantly to the extracurricular life here at Malden Catholic High School. He is a two-sport varsity athlete, playing hockey and baseball, and his coaches call him an athlete of superior ability, great heart, and good humor. He is a vital member of the Sports Debate Club and the Investment Club, where he showcases his quick wit and amiability. Throughout the school year, has held a job, working at a local ice cream shop. Along with this part time position, this summer, he also worked for the boys and girls club, teaching inner city children to sail.

Along with his strong intellect, excellent work habits and diverse talents, his greatest strength lies in his winning personality.
